## **Extracts from the Coal and Other Mines (Shafts, Outlets and Roads) Regulations, 1956**

**Regulation 1.** These regulations shall apply to every mine of coal, stratified Ironstone, shale or fireclay. . . .

**Regulation 14.** At every mine a competent person appointed for that purpose by the manager shall **at intervals not exceeding seven days**, or, *in the case of a shaft or staple-pit in the course of being sunk, 24 hours*, examine thoroughly the state of any shaft, staple-pit and unwalkable outlet through which persons are carried, and shall forthwith make and sign in a book provided for the purpose by the owner of the mine a full and accurate report of the result of the examination.

### **General Provisions relating to Report etc. Books**

*Section 10 of the Act* requires the manager of every mine either to read each report himself forthwith or to secure that it is read forthwith by a competent person charged with the duty of bringing promptly to the notice of the manager any matter of an abnormal or unusual nature or which requires, or may require, steps to be taken by the manager or some other person.

*Section 133 of the Act* requires every entry in any report etc. book, or a copy of that entry, to be preserved for three years (or a longer or shorter period if prescribed) and to be kept at the office at the mine or at some other place approved by an inspector. These entries must be open to inspection by any person employed at the mine, or his authorised representative.
