DI-DI SHEARER - SINGLE AND DOUBLE SHIFTING

GENERAL

This Agreement is made under the terms and conditions of the Main North Staffs: Power Loading Agreement dated 4th January, 1960.

- A. The face is power loaded by a Di-Di Shearer advancing at the rate of 2'0" per shear run, and 4 shear runs are to be made in two shifts. To enable the shearer to operate there are two stables at either end of the face which are kept in advance of the main face. The average working thickness of the seam is 2'4" and the system of Supports is Hydraulic Props and 6'9" Chesterfield Bars.
- B. It is hereby agreed that the following number of men allocated to the tasks as itemised below, to form two teams shall be responsible individually and collectively for advancing the whole face. The men shall be paid equally in accordance with the Power Loading Agreement. The team to consist of.

- C. (i) The Norm referred to in item 4 of the Main Power Loading Agreement of 4th January, 1960, for the single shift shall be 265 (Two hundred & Sixty-five yards)
- (ii) The Norm referred to in item 4 of the Main Power Loading Agreement of 4th January, 1960, for the double shift shall be 530 (Five hundred & Thirty yards.)
- D. (i) In respect of item 6 of the Main Power Loading Agreement the further bonus for the performance of an additional task in excess of the agreed 265 (Two hundred and Sixty Five yards) for single shifting shall be 2d. (Two pence) per man per yard.
- (ii) In respect of item 6 of the Main Power Loading Agreement the further bonus for the performance of an additional task in excess of the agreed 530 (Five hundred and Thirty yards) for double shifting shall be 1d. (One penny) per man per yard.
- E. The Norm and any excess yardage shall include the following:
- (i) Shearing, Flitting and Loading all the coal on to the conveyor
- (a) Oiling the machine as directed.

- (b) Replacing damaged or worn drum picks.
 - (c) Maintaining and ~~using~~ whilst shearing the dust suppression apparatus fitted to the machine.
 - (d) Keeping the cables free from damage and endeavouring to examine externally before use.
- (ii) Pushing over the armoured conveyor, grading cleaning up, caving and timbering the face according to the Support Rules

- (a) Advancing the conveyor forward completely, including the driving units and the shearer.
- (b) Cleaning up all loose coal in front of the conveyor.
- (c) Caving and moving the chocks over and timbering the face according to support rules.

(iii) Main Gate Stable - Advancing 4'0" per shift

Performing all the work necessary by maintaining the stable at least 8 (eight) yards in length and one turnover in advance of the main face, and setting all the supports in accordance with the Support Rules.

(iv) Return Gate Stable - Advancing 4'0" per shift

Performing all the work necessary to maintain the stable at least 14 (fourteen) yards in length and one turnover in advance of the main face, and setting all the supports in accordance with the support Rules.

- F. The National Coal Board to supply explosives free. The men to be responsible for the transport of explosives to their working place.
- G. This Agreement cancels all previous arrangements and agreements and is to be operative as and from Monday, 25th JANUARY, 1965.





2. An increase in the waste drawing price from 1/2d. to 1/8d per lineal yard.

3. Waste edge roof Supports to be paid at 6d. per prop.

THE DISPUTES COMMITTEE AWARD :-

1. For a pack height of 3'0" (three feet) and a depth of cut of 5'6" (five feet six inches) an increase in the packing price is 5/9½d (five shillings and Ninepence Halfpenny) per lineal yard.
2. The price per lineal yard for packing shall increase or decrease 5.8d (five point eightpence) per lineal yard per 3" (three inches) as the height of the pack increases or decreases to more than or less than 3'0" (three feet).



CHATTERLEY WHITFIELD COLLIERY.

This is a temporary agreement made under the terms and conditions of the Main North Staffs. Power Loading Agreement dated 4th January, 1960, whilst the present faulted and geological conditions persist. The agreement is based on three shears per double shift. When the conditions improve so that a four shear performance is possible it shall be the subject of fresh negotiations.

A. The face is power loaded by a Disc Shearer advancing at the rate of 2' 3" per shear run and three shear runs are to be made in a double shift. To enable the shearer to operate there are two stables at either end of the face which are kept in advance of the main face. The system of supports is hydraulic props, Chesterfield bars and Desford chocks set at 3' 6" centres. The face is caved. The shear length at present is 154 yards.

B. It is hereby agreed that the following numbers of men allocated the tasks as itemised below shall form two teams and be responsible individually and collectively for advancing the whole face. The men shall be paid equally in accordance with the Power Loading Agreement. Each team to consist of :-

F.44 Shearer Operators	2 men
F.20 and F.6 Pushing Over the Armoured Conveyor, Grading, Cleaning Up, Timbering, and Moving Over the Desford Chocks and dealing with the fault.	22 men
F.1 Main Gate Stable and Deep Side	7 men
F.1 Return Gate Stable	5 men

Total for the two teams

36 men

C. The norm referred to in Item 4 of the Main Power Loading Agreement of 4th January, 1960, for the team shall be:-

306 (Three hundred and six) yards.

D. In respect of Item 6 of the Main Power Loading Agreement the further bonus for the performance of an additional task in excess of the agreed 306 (Three hundred and six) yards for the team as above shall be :-

2d. (Two pence) per man per yard.

E. The norm and any excess yardage shall include the following:

(i) Shearing, Flitting and Loading all the coal onto the conveyor

- (a) Oiling the machine as directed.
- (b) Replacing the damaged or worn drum picks.

- (c) Maintaining and using the dust suppression apparatus fitted to the machine.
 - (d) Keeping the cables free from damage and examining externally before use.
- (ii) Pushing Over the Armoured Conveyor, Grading, Cleaning Up, and Timbering the face according to the support rules
- (a) Advancing the conveyor forward and completely, including the driving units and the shearer.
 - (b) Cleaning up all loose coal in front of the conveyor.
 - (c) Grading the conveyor.
 - (d) Moving Over the Desford Chocks.
 - (e) Timbering the face according to the support rules including dealing with the faults.
- (iii) Main Gate Stable and Deep Side - Pulsed Infusion
- (a) Performing all the work necessary by maintaining the stable and deep side at least 13 (thirteen) yards in length and one turnover in advance of the main face.
 - (b) Setting all the supports in accordance with the support rules.
- (iv) Return Gate Stable - Pulsed Infusion
- (a) Performing all the work necessary to maintain the stable at least 7 (seven) yards in length and one turnover in advance of the main face.
 - (b) Setting all the supports in accordance with the support rules.
- F. The National Coal Board to supply explosives free. The men to be responsible for the transport of explosives to their working places.
- G. This agreement cancels all previous arrangements and agreements, and is to be operative as and from Monday, 6th September, 1965.

- D. IT IS AGREED that in respect of item 6 of the above Agreement dated the Fourth of January 1960, the further bonus for the performance of an additional task in excess of the agreed 350 (Three hundred and Fifty) yards for the two teams, as previously stated, shall be paid at the rate of 2d. (Two pence) gross, per man per yard in excess of the above 'Norm'.

1. SUBJECT OF CONTRACT.

- (A). TOP STABLE - performing all the work necessary to maintain the Stable at least 5'0" in advance of the main plough face and 13 yards in length, including moving in the beam and timbering as required by the Support Rules, including the Roadhead Supports
- FOUR MEN
- (B). BOTTOM STABLE AND DEEPSIDE - performing all the work necessary to maintain the stable at least 5'0" in advance of the main plough face and 19 yards in length and timbering as required by the Support Rules including the Roadhead Supports
- FIVE MEN
- (C). PLOUGHING & SUPPORTS - Attending to the plough, moving up the Rams as required, advancing the Drive Units with the automatic devices provided and advancing the supports as required by the Support Rules

2. GENERAL CONDITIONS.



4'0" (Four Feet) shall be 4/3d (Four shillings and Threepence)
per man per 3" (Three Inches) of completed face advance."

2. This amendment shall be effective from MONDAY 9th April 1962.



1. SUBJECT OF CONTRACT.

- (A). TOP STABLE - performing all the work necessary to maintain the stable at least 5'0" in advance of the main plough face and 10 yards in length, and timbering as required by the Support Rules, including Roadhead Supports - THREE MEN.
- (B). BOTTOM STABLE AND DEEPSIDE - performing all the work necessary to maintain the stable and Deepside at least 5'0" in advance of the main plough face and 20 yards in length; timbering as required by the Support Rules, including the Roadhead Supports - FIVE MEN.
- (C). PLOUGHING - attending to the plough, moving up the rams as required and advancing the drive units with the automatic devices provided - TWO MEN.
- (D). SUPPORTS - advancing the supports as required by the Support Rules, moving in the beams, cables and hoses and equipment to the satisfaction of the Management - SIX MEN.

2. GENERAL CONDITIONS.

The main plough face, excluding the stables as stated in Para: (1) above is 123 yards (ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE YARDS) in length.

The face is approximately on strike, with gradient on line of face at 1 in 4. The face will work on a 24 hour cycle with a five foot advance in one drawing shift, ploughing off the solid coal and loading direct on to the armoured conveyor. The working thickness of the seam is 5'0". The system of supports is Dowty Props and G.H.H. Motre Link Bars set at 3 ft. intervals.

3. TEAM.

The team for all the operations as described in paragraph (1) above shall be 16 (SIXTEEN) fully trained men, subject to the conditions of paragraph 3. of the Main North Staffs: District Agreement dated 4th January, 1960.

4. METHOD OF PAYMENT.

- (a). The Wage Rates shall be in accordance with paragraphs 5. and 6. of the above District Agreement.
 - (b). The 'Norm' in accordance with paragraph 4. of the above District Agreement shall be 4'0" (FOUR FEET) Face advance, which shall be measured and mutually agreed each day.
 - (c). Subject to the conditions of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3. of this Pit Agreement and in accordance with paragraph 6. of the above District Agreement the further bonus for additional face advance in excess of the 'Norm' of 4'0" (FOUR FEET) shall be 3/5d. (Three Shillings and Fivepence Farthing) per man per 3" (Three Inches) of completed face advance.
5. The National Coal Board to supply explosives free. The men to be responsible for the transport of explosives to their working place.
 6. No payments outside the aforementioned Power Loading Agreement shall be paid.
 7. This Agreement cancels in full all previous arrangements and agreements and is to be operative as and from Monday, 17th October, 1960.



GETTING & FILLING MACHINE CUT
COAL ON TO CONVEYORS.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED THAT:

1. The price to be paid for getting and filling prepared machine cut coal on to conveyors, cleaning up the spillage on both sides of the face conveyor and for setting all the necessary supports required by the Support Rules, with the exception of Landing and gearhead bars, and/or girders for a 4'6" height and 4'6" depth of cut, shall be at:
7/2d (Seven Shillings and Twopence) gross per lineal yard.
2. The price per lineal yard shall increase or decrease by 5d (Fivepence) per 3" as the depth of cut increases or decreases to more than or less than 4'6".
3. The price per lineal yard shall increase or decrease by 5d (Five-pence) per 3" as the height increases or decreases to more than or less than 4'6".
4. The setting of 'H' Section girders shall be at the rate of
6d (Sixpence) per foot run.
5. Payment for the boring of the face coal holes shall remain as at present at
3d (Threepence) per ton.
6. Mutually agreed measurements between the men and Management shall take place daily of the face height at ten yard intervals, and weekly of the face advance.
7. The payment for work outside the contract and abnormalities shall be agreed between the men and the Management.
8. The National Coal Board to supply the men with explosives free; The men to be responsible for the transport of Explosives to their working place.
9. This Agreement cancels in full all previous arrangements and agreements and is to be operative as and from Monday, 17th October, 1960.

FILLING AND BORING CONTRACT.

6. There was, in addition, discussion of the question of the separation of the contract for boring from the filling contract, but I am not satisfied, on the evidence, that a case has been made out for effecting such separation. Since 1953, this contract has been considered at various levels in the conciliation procedure on at least three occasions, and the question of separation of boring from filling either has not been raised, or has been rejected on those occasions; I, therefore, feel that it would be wrong to separate the two items merely because at other Collieries a different system is operated, and I am impressed by the Management's argument that practical difficulties, and a loss of teamwork, might result if the two items were separated.


10. Therefore, I make my award in the following terms:

(a). From the date when conventional methods of working were reintroduced into the Bullhurst seam at the Chatterley/Whitfield Colliery in 1959, up to and including the pay week in which this Award is delivered, the Bullhurst seam rate for filling and setting the necessary face supports shall be $3/4\frac{1}{2}$ d per ton, and for boring 3d. per ton.

(b). Thereafter, the rate for filling and setting face supports shall be $3/6$ d per ton, and for boring 3d. per ton.



This Award relates to No. 12. South Bullhurst Face only : but
from Paragraph 4. of the Umpire's Award if other Faces revert in the near
future to conventional methods it may be only common sense for the parties to
adopt the Award for these Faces.

"the new Price List for packing and waste drawing on No. 12. South Bullhurst Face, as from
the date when conventional working was reinstituted in September, 1959, shall be as follows :-

- (1). For packing, where the pack is 4' 6" high and the depth of cut 4' 6", 7/- gross
per lineal yard of pack as measured on the face line.
Where either the height of the pack or the depth of cut or both varies above or below
4' 6", the rate of 7/-d is to be varied proportionately to the variations in the height
and/or depth.
- (2). Where packs exceed the normal 5 yards in Length, an additional 1/6d per yard is to be
paid for ridding.
- (3). For the level 8 yards pack, a standard payment of 26/-d per pack for ridding.
- (4). For waste drawing, 1/3d gross per lineal yard of waste as measured on the face line.
- (5). For moving over chocks, 2/6d per chock. "



POWER LOADING AGREEMENT.

I think it is clearly understood by all management that the Consolidated Rate is 53/- per shift with a Bonus Rate of 5/- per shift paid for completion of the task within the normal shift.


As regards the payment of the 5/-, this payment is within the discretion of the Manager where he feels the team have really tried hard but have failed to complete the task within the shift due to something happening entirely out of their control. This discretionary power was really intended to cover "near misses".

In addition to the previously mentioned rates, there is also, as you are well aware, secondary bonuses for work done over and above the agreed Norm.

I am now informed that the N.U.M. are trying at one or two collieries to get abnormality payment where secondary bonus has not been earned. This is not allowable and nothing should be paid additional to the agreed rates and of course overtime when worked.

Should you get an application for abnormality payments in addition to the payments authorised by the Agreement, I should be pleased if you would immediately inform Mr. Job, the Area Industrial Relations Officer.

On the instructions of the Joint Secretaries of the West Midlands District Conciliation Board, a Disputes Committee met at Chatterley-Whitfield Colliery on Wednesday, 17th April, 1957, to consider an application for a review of the Fillers' contract in the Little Row Seam.

From the evidence presented, it is obvious that the Little Row is a difficult face to work and there is difficulty in maintaining sufficient manpower. The seam thins to sometimes less than a working height of 2'0", but an average of 2'8" is given. In normal conditions 21 men can fill the coal produced, but evidence was given that 21 men have rarely completed a full turnover because of the varying conditions.

The Disputes Committee have agreed on revision and make the following AWARD :-

For Getting and Filling coal on to conveyors and Setting all necessary supports required by the Supports Rules, with the exception of Landing and gearhead bars and/or girders; and fast ends, the rate shall be :-

3/6d. (THREE SHILLINGS & SIX PENCE) per ton, gross, as at present.

Where the seam thins to less than 3'0", an additional payment shall be made of 1d. (ONE PENNY) per inch for each inch by which the seam thins below 3'0".

The payment for girders shall be at the rate of 6d. (SIX PENCE) per foot, as at present.

The Payment for fast ends shall be at 20/-d. (TWENTY SHILLINGS) each fast end, gross, as at present.

The present price for drilling coal holes shall remain at 7d. (SEVEN PENCE) per hole, gross, per 5'0" in depth and for back holes at 3½d. (THREE PENCE HALFPENNY) per hole, gross.

Payment for bannock dirt shall continue at the rate of 5d. (FIVE PENCE) per cubic foot. The method now in operation of measuring the thickness of the coal shall also continue.

(One Shilling and Sixpence) per yard, and payment of Dowty props set at waste edges at 6d. (Sixpence) per setting.
2. (a) The existing price for packing is 5/4d. (Five Shillings and fourpence) per lineal yard to the height of the seam and to depth of cut of 5 ft. (five feet).
(b) Waste Drawing is paid at 1/6d. (One Shilling and sixpence) per yard.
(c) Withdrawing and re-setting chocks is paid at the rate of 2/6d. (Two Shillings and sixpence) per chock.
(d) There is a disputed payment for ridding for the building of the 8 (eight) yards level pack.
3. It was established:-
(a) that packs have been increased in length from four to five yards,
(b) Wastes have been reduced in length by two and a half yards,
(c) changes in the method of waste edge supports have been introduced.
4. The DISPUTES COMMITTEE AWARD :
(a) Payment for packing shall continue to be paid at the existing rate of 5/4d. (Five shillings and fourpence) per lineal yard at seam height and 5 ft. (five feet) depth of cut.
(b) For ridding dirt into the 8 (eight) yards main level pack, there shall be additional to the payment for packing a payment of 20/- (Twenty Shillings).
(c) Where packs are built Five yards in length, there shall be a ridding payment of 1/3d. (One Shilling and threepence) for the fifth yard.
(d) The payment for the withdrawal of waste supports shall be 1/8d. (One shilling and eightpence) per lineal yard. This payment shall include for the withdrawal and re-setting of the additional Dowty props at the waste edges, in accordance with the Support Rules, August, 1959.
(e) Where chocks are withdrawn and reset the payment shall be 2/6d. (Two shillings and sixpence) per chock.
5. The Waste men and packers shall be responsible for leaving the withdrawn supports in an upright position.

To enable the shearer to operate there are two stables at either end of the face which are kept in advance of the main face. The system of supports is hydraulic props, Link Bars, Cherterfield bars and Desford Chocks. The face is Stowed. The shear length at present is 160 yards.

B. It is hereby agreed that the following numbers of men allocated the tasks as itemised below shall form two teams and be responsible individually and collectively for advancing the whole face. The men shall be paid equally in accordance with the Power Loading Agreement. Each team to consist of:-

F.20 and F.6 Pushing over the armoured conveyor, Grading, Cleaning up, Timbering	8 men

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C. The norm referred to in Item 4 of the Main Power Loading Agreement of 4th January, 1960; for the 2 teams shall be:-

428 (Four hundred and twenty eight) yards.

D. In respect of Item 6 of the Main Power Loading Agreement the further bonus for the performance of an additional task in excess of the agreed norm as above shall be:-

1½d. (Threehalfpence) per man per yard.

E. The norm and any excess yardage shall include the following.

(i) Shearing, Flitting and Loading all the coal onto the conveyor

- Oiling the machine as directed
- Replacing the damaged or worn drum picks





Metre Link Bars set at metre intervals and in between each Bar a "walking" middle set consisting of a 6' 6" heavy wooden Bar is advanced as required. There are also 2 faults on the face consisting of a 2 ft upthrow and a 4 ft upthrow.

This Agreement is made under the terms and conditions of the Main North Staffs: Power Loading Agreement dated 4th January 1960.

Any change in working conditions, for example, Height, Face advance, Manpower, changes in faults etc., will result in new negotiations for Manpower, Norm and Secondary Bonus.

2. SUBJECT OF CONTRACT.

(A) TOP STABLE - performing all the work necessary to maintain the stable at least one metre in advance of the main plough face and 10 yards in length, keeping the plough sprocket clean and advancing the plough gear with the automatic devices. The team for all the operations as described in para 2. above shall be 22 (TWENTY-TWO) fully trained men, subject to the conditions of para 3. of the Main North Staffs. District Agreement dated 4th January, 1960.

6. No payments outside the aforementioned Power Loading Agreement shall be paid.

The Joint Secretaries of the West Midlands District Conciliation Board instructed a Disputes Committee to deal with an application by the National Union of Mineworkers for a revision of the piecework rates for packing and waste drawing for the South Moss Seam Face at Chatterley-Whitfield Colliery. The Disputes Committee met on Tuesday, 28th June, 1960.

The present South Moss Face is reducing in length by about two yards per day because of a fault running diagonally across the face. It is anticipated that the present face will be worked out within the near future. The Disputes Committee have made an Award which is to be applied only to the present South Moss face.

THE DISPUTES COMMITTEE AWARD -

1. The packing price at a height of 4'6" and depth of turnover of 4'6" shall continue as at present at 7/- (Seven Shillings) per lineal yard.
2. For any reduction or increase in the height of the pack, an increment of 4³/_d. (Fourpence three farthings) shall be applied for each three inches increase or decrease in height above or below 4'6".
3. For any reduction or increase in the depth of turnover an increment of 4³/_d (Fourpence three farthings) shall be applied for each three inches increase or decrease in depth of turnover above or below 4'6".
4. Additional height increments as payment for packing shall be applied up to and including packs of 5'6" in height. Where, through bad roof or abnormal conditions, packs of over 5'6" in height have to be built, this shall be regarded as an abnormality. Payment for such packs shall be assessed through negotiations between Management and men and, if necessary, with Union representatives. It may be advisable in certain cases of persistent abnormalities for a joint assessment to be made on the face.
5. Packs up to and including four yards in length shall be regarded as normal seam length packs. Where packs of up to six yards in length are built, there shall be a ridding price of 1/6d (One shilling and sixpence) per yard paid for the fifth and sixth yards of the packs so constructed.
6. Where packs of eight yards in length are built, the payment shall be the normal packing price plus an additional payment for ridding of 12/6d. (Twelve shillings and sixpence) for the whole pack.







The Agreements carry the following Clauses;

Copy Typists shall be paid not less than the rates quoted.

Operators of other Office Machines. shall be paid not less than the rates set out; individual Operators whose work is particularly complex or requires exceptional skill may be paid an allowance which will depend on the complexity of the work performed and the skill of operation. The amount (if any) to be paid in excess of these rates shall be a matter for settlement within the Division.

Telephone Operators, as far as Telephone Operators who were in employment with the Board when the separate scales were proposed they will retain Grade 11 scales on a personal basis and be given the benefit of the Equal Pay Agreement.
